Visitors will discover how the Games began in ancient Greece, and the traditions and ideals that shaped the competitions.

Dear Friends,

Welcome to the Assumption Greek Orthodox Church's 2026 GreekFest!

Along with sharing our Greek American culture with you, we invite you to join us in celebrating our beloved United States of America's 250th anniversary of its founding. We are all richly blessed to be a part of this great nation of ours, where freedom, liberty, opportunity, equality under the rule of law, the pursuit of truth and justice, and the pursuit of happiness are among its foundational ideals. Those were ideals first defined about 2,500 years ago by the classical Greeks.

Since its inception, the United States has been called "The Great Experiment" because the Founding Fathers wondered whether they could create a nation based on principles first articulated by the Greeks, later developed by the Romans, and much later by the philosophers of the Enlightenment. They asked, "From what we've learned from the past, can we create a nation?" Their answer was a resounding, "YES!" However, before they could create a nation, the Founding Fathers had to first declare their independence from the British Empire and fight a war to secure their freedom. That Declaration of Independence is what we celebrate this year: 250 years, 1776–2026.

The American Revolution did more than create our nation. In the decades that followed, many other peoples across the globe were inspired to adopt the ideals of the Declaration of Independence to recreate their nations. Among those were the Greeks, who, after 400 years of slavery under the Ottoman Turks, declared their independence, revolted, and fought a bloody war for over eight years (1821–1829) to earn their freedom; the modern Greek nation-state was born. In short, the Greeks primarily inspired the Founding Fathers of our country, and 50 years later, the American Revolution inspired the Greeks to be free.

The ideals of the Declaration of Independence have bound Greeks and Americans for 250 years; the two nations have been closest allies in every military engagement ever since. From 1890–1921, approximately 500,000 Greeks immigrated to the United States. In the 1950s, another 40,000 arrived. During the 1960s and 1970s, an additional 80,000 immigrated to America. Today, there are over 3 million Greeks or citizens of Greek descent living in the United States who are proud to be Greek and fiercely patriotic Americans.

This year's GreekFest celebrates our nation's 250th anniversary and the unique Greek American culture that has successfully assimilated into it. Enjoy our community and its ancient Orthodox Christian faith. Savor our foods. Take pleasure in our music and dancing. Be Greek for a day, and proud Americans forever!
